Financial Aid Probation Letter

Dear Student,

I am writing this letter to inform you that, due to lack of satisfactory academic progress (SAP), you have been placed on financial aid probation. Students on financial aid probation are still eligible for Federal Student Aid. However, failure to meet the satisfactory academic progress during the next semester enrolled in will result in financial aid suspension. Students on financial aid suspension are not eligible for Federal Student Aid. Financial aid probation is different from Academic Probation, see the Student Handbook.

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS FOR FINANCIAL AID

To maintain eligibility for federal student aid, students must maintain satisfactory academic progress. Satisfactory academic progress is based on attempted credits which include all credits enrolled in at the end of the drop-add period. Progress will be monitored each semester and has two components:

- 1) Satisfactory grade point average.

Number of Credits Attempted	Minimum Cumulative GPA
1-14	1.5
15- 29	1.7
30-44	1.9
45 or more	2.0

- 2) Satisfactory degree progress, which means completing a minimum 67% of credits attempted.

END OF SEMESTER RE-EVALUATION

We will re-evaluate at the end of the semester following the "financial aid probationary" period for either two status options:

Good Standing – eligible to receive financial aid

If the overall SAP Policy requirements are met at the end of the probationary semester, your SAP status will be updated to ‘good standing’ (making satisfactory academic progress) beginning with the next semester. You will be eligible to receive financial aid.

Financial Aid Suspension – not eligible to receive financial aid If the overall SAP Policy requirements are not met at the end of the probationary semester, then you be placed on Financial Aid Suspension and you will be suspended from receiving any financial aid and/or Sumner Grant funds beginning with the next semester and for future semesters until the SAP Policy requirements have once again been met.

Any federal student aid and/or Sumner Grant aid previously awarded for the upcoming semester will be canceled.
